**Wed 26**<sup>th</sup> *'Be still and know that I am God'*. **Psalm 46 v.10** Gracious God, when our cries seem unheeded, when no effort bears fruit, when the sun sets, help us to be still.

**Thu 27**<sup>th</sup> When You lived on earth, Lord Jesus, You healed the sick. We pray for people in our community who have suddenly been diagnosed with cancer or a similar disease. Thank You that you use medical research to bring healing today. Please make treatment effective for our friends and use our prayers for them as well.

Fri 28<sup>th</sup> But the meek will inherit the land and enjoy great peace'. (Psalm 37.11) The meek are those who humbly acknowledge their dependence on the goodness and grace of God and allow themselves no arrogance towards others. Keep us meek, Lord! Save us from exalting ourselves!

**Sat 29**<sup>th</sup> We pray for the Christmas Fayre taking place next month; pray for good weather and support from the local community.

**Sun 30**<sup>th</sup> **ST ANDREW'S DAY**: Our Patron Saint has always been a great example of the type of person Jesus is looking for in His followers today - friendly, approachable and looking for opportunities to introduce others to their Master. Pray that our service this evening and the switching on of the Christmas Tree lights may be meaningful, spiritually uplifting and also a time when people on the edge of the church see our Faith lived out in a real and attractive manner.

- **Tue 18**<sup>th</sup> Merciful God, keep us safe and considerate as we travel around, particularly as road conditions can be uncertain. Comfort those who have lost loved ones in tragic accidents in our County.
- **Wed 19**<sup>th</sup> PCC meet this evening. We pray that all decisions made may be for the spiritual health of our congregation and the extension of God's Kingdom in our community.
- **Thu 20**<sup>th</sup> Every week we seem to hear of another person diagnosed with cancer. Merciful Lord, comfort them and their families. Thank You for the wonderful support of the Macmillan and Marie Curie Nurses. Strengthen and help these nurses and each person for whom they care.
- **Fri 21**<sup>st</sup> Prayer is not simply asking God for the pleasant things we desire, but an earnest yearning for the will of God, be it sweet or bitter. Show me Your will for me today, Lord!
- Sat 22<sup>nd</sup> Jesus answered (the tempter), 'It is written: "Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." Matt. 4.4. Jesus prays that we will be sealed and changed by the truth that leads to salvation.
